be awarded by Nov. 30.

Clark Allen, director of the Poplar Bluff Parks and Recreation Department, has been working for several years to complete a bike/pedestrian trail along Pike Creek, but has run into difficulty obtaining the necessary right-of-way.

When contacted at his office, Allen said the Phase 2 trail will extend west from Pike Creek along Kanell Boulevard (Highway PP) to Shelby Road and then along Shelby Road from Kanell Boulevard to Oak Grove Road.

Allen noted the right-of-way is already available along the roads and MoDOT has approved the change of scope for the relocation to Kanell Boulevard. The Poplar Bluff Regional Transportation Development District board has approved use of the right-of-way along Shelby Road.

The subgrade for the trail is already in place along Shelby Road from the Pike Creek bridge to Oak Grove Road.

"The final engineering design plan for the new

location will be submitted to MoDOT by June," said Dominic Thompson, an engineer with Smith and Company of Poplar Bluff.

He expects to receive approval from MoDOT by the end of July.

"We hope to advertise for bids by August," Thompson said. "Current plans are to start the project in the fall of 2013 and have the trail completed in the spring of 2014."

An aviation project consultant agreement with Smith and Company concerning the preliminary and final design work on the runway and taxiway slurry and crack sealing project at Poplar Bluff Municipal Airport also was approved.

Airport Manager Mike Smith said the improvements will involve crack repairs on the runway and taxiway, slurry seal over the asphalt portion of the runway and new markings on the taxiway and runway.

"The last time we did this was in 2006," Smith said. "It needs to be done every six or seven years."

Smith and Company will submit the final plans within 90 days. The design cost is estimated at \$37,500.

A recommendation from

the Poplar Bluff Planning and Zoning Commission to deny a request from Phil Childress of Poplar Bluff to vacate a portion of undeveloped Rio Vista Drive east of 115 W. Pine St. was tabled.

"Some legal issues have come up," Mayor Ed DeGaris said.

11 terrorist attacks had four driver's license and ID cards from three states.

But the federal law prompted cost and privacy concerns. In Missouri, a law approved in 2009 prohibits the state from changing driver's license application procedures to comply with the Real ID law. It also requires state government to protect residents' privacy.

Oliver noted that Griffin wants a permit for a small pistol that he does not plan on carrying often.

Oliver said the lawsuit names as the defendant the agent of the license office in Stoddard County and that the restraining order affects that office.
